

How the school at Nakulabye has changed

In 2004:

- 10 leaking ramshackle, classrooms.
- no water
- pit latrine toilets
- staff often go without pay
- 1/4 acre insecure site on community land



In 2009:

- large site
- simple purpose built classrooms
- flush toilet blocks with wash basins
- outside play area suitable for PE
- electricity
- site fenced and secure allowing storage of educational items
- academic standards are rising
- resource centre constructed



How lives at Nakulabye have changed in the last 5 years

- Children are reported as being healthier.
- The new toilets have increased the cleanliness of children.
- Mosquito nets have been distributed to all children and immunizations have taken place
- The school has received positive feedback from the local Inspector of Schools and academic performance is now among the best in the area
- There are regular curriculum links with UK schools and a new curriculum link with International School of Uganda
- Teachers now receive regular salaries and training
- The community social worker supports the AIDS orphans and families
- FAU's provision of daily maize porridge helps children concentrate in lessons

Nakulabye moving forward

- the Headmaster is planning for the long term sustainability of the school. He is very pro-active for the future
- income and expenditure accounts are maintained
- the school aims to meet the needs of more students
- staff receive continuing training
- there are regular teaching visits from an ACET Uganda trainer
- with electricity now in place the school is looking to install some second hand computers
- with the site secure the school can store educational resources, and this will enhance opportunities for learning
- potential to provide vocational training which is especially needed for the girls
- potential to offer learning opportunities to the community
